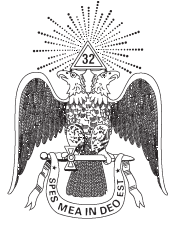

Illustrious Robert L. Harder, 33° and Bro. Joseph F. Wiegert 32° KCCH Reunion

Ill. Brother Robert L. Harder, 33° was born August 29, 1927. He was a lifelong resident of St. Louis. Married to former Betty Jean Schraven in 1946. They raised a family with six children, Barbara Lee, Deborah Jean, Betsy Lee and son, John Robert; Roberta Lee and Billy preceded him in death.

Robert retired as vice president of operations of Steelweld Equipment Company of St. Clair, MO. Bob dedicated his life to working with youth through the Kirkwood Khoury League and Masonic organizations of DeMolay and Jobs Daughters. He sponsored and managed the Kirkwood Yankees (Khoury League) during the 1960's.

He then began working with Kirkwood DeMolay and served as a dear and cherished advisor for 42 years. He became Chairman of the Advisory Board in 1978, serving continuously through May of 2006, earning many awards including Lifetime Achievement Award, Advisor of the Year, Member of the International Supreme Council and the Missouri DeMolay Hall of Fame.

Bob was Past Master Kirkwood Lodge #484 A.F and A.M., Past District Deputy Grand Master District #57. He was made a Knight Commander of the Court of Honour in 1987, served as Commander of the Council Kadosh, St. Louis Scottish Rite, 1987-1988, and was coroneted a Inspector General Honorary, 33rd Degree in November 1993.

Ill. Brother Harder passed on to the Great Architect of the Universe on May 30, 2006. at the age of 78.

Brother Joseph F. Wiegert, 32°, KCCH, was born on New Years Day 1928 in St. Louis, Missouri to Charles and Anna Wiegert. He had two brother Charles and Fred (both of whom were also Masons). He was a first generation American, both parents came Germany. His Uncle Otto (Wiegert) was a Mason, and his Nephew Charlie is a Mason.

He graduated from Cleveland High School in 1946, attended Harris Junior College and then served in the Army. Upon discharge from the Army he began working at Anheuser-Busch in 1947 as a Brewer. He married the former Mary Sweeney in 1950. They have two daughters, Katherine (married to Steve Moss) with two grandsons and Joanna (married to Matt Begeske). Bro. Joe retired from Anheuser-Busch after 42 years in 1989.

He joined Pomegranate Lodge #95 in 1949 and became a dual member of Magnolia Lodge in 1985 where he served a Master in 1989. He also served as DDGM in 1992 and 1993.

Joined the Scottish Rite in December 1972 where he was Chairman of the Americanism Committee, Candidates Committee, assisted in ritual work, Scottish Rite Club, member of the Reception Committee and was on the Board of the Scottish Rite Clinic. Was made a Knight Commander of the Court of Honour in October 1981.

Brother Joe also served in many York Rite Bodies, including High Priest of Oriental Chapter in 2000, Illustrious Master of Jeremiah Council in 2004 and Commander of Ascalon Commandery in 2001 where he received numerous awards and honors including Council Merit Award, Order of the Silver Trowel and KYCH.

He joined Moolah Shrine in 1972 and was President of the Ceremonial Cast in 1984, Chairman of Cookbook Committee, Potentates Aide, made an Ambassador in 1995, Past Masters Degree Team and Royal Order of Jesters,. He was a member of Alhambra Grotto, Royal Order of Scotland, A.M.D. And almost every other Masonic organization.

Brother Wiegert was called to the celestial Grand Lodge above, on March 7, 2006.

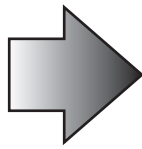

In our desire to keep the membership well informed on the many projects at the Cathedral this column will be a regular feature of the **RiteWay**. First I want to thank Curt Fulbright and P.J. Pyle for their hard work during these past few months. Our building is in better condition from their efforts and concern for our property.

Besides the continuing cleaning and support of events, we continue to work on the Kitchen. We have completed a proper inventory of all kitchen assets. Most of the equipment has been cleaned, counted and stored for future use. We will be repairing or replacing a few items and hope to add a new steam line for our food service. Our pantry is being organized better to support our events and snack bars operations for shows.

Hard work has gone into cleaning all the blower rooms in anticipation of the planned repairs of our A/C system. For many years these area were used as storerooms and were pretty much left on their own. If our fundraising efforts prove successful we may be able to have Air Conditioning by next summer.

We are also fixing up the old museum as a regular rehearsal room for the Scottish Rite Youth Wind Ensemble. This should help keep the Auditorium available for other use and control the access of the building during evening hours. The final repairs to the 4th level bathroom makes this possible.

The Executive Secretary has moved back into the traditional office and our small conference room is now available for committee meetings. We hope to keep it a non-smoking room, but have kept the smoke area in the hallway.

We have added a new feature to the Auditorium... A giant screen and projector (18' x 24'). We will be looking to use it with the future ritual presentation material from Supreme Council. It is also suitable for movies, presentations and NFL Football. We may even show a movie on Friday night of Reunion Weekend. Looks great and with our auditorium sound system it is an experience.
