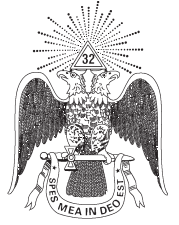

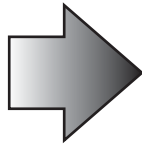

Thank you to the new Advisory (Strategic Planning) Committee for all your late nights, patience and insight. I believe that this group is really looking hard to understand the issues faced by Masonry and especially the Scottish Rite. Special thanks to Jim Shiels for guiding us through this process.

In this issue of the Rite Way is the beginning report of our sessions. We are at the point where we will begin to put together Action Plans. Many of these plans will require our membership's cooperation, understanding, time, blood, sweat, tears and money to accomplish.

# Scottish Rite Cathedral Facts

In the transaction of the Supreme Council for 1868, Bro. Martin Collins , 33° S.G.I.G. Reported that "At St. Louis in 1867 regarding the O'Sullivan Lodge of Perfection.

December 13, 1872 a charter was granted to reorganize the O'Sullivan Lodge of Perfection, No. 1, with 27 members. By 1879 the O'Sullivan Lodge cease to exist.

October 19, 1882 St. Louis Lodge of Perfection No. 1 received its permanent Charter. A temporary one having been issued April 23, 1881.

- B. Create a plan for the membership to communicate to the valley and it's organizations.

**3. Membership (153) Issue: Membership is declining and little is being done to retain, restore, engage and recruit members.**

Action Plans:

- A. Investigate why membership is declining.
- B. Develop a plan to recruit members
- C. Develop a plan to engage new members
- D. Develop a plan to retain members
- E. Develop a plan to restore members

**4. Reunion (150) Issue: The reunion format could do more to convey a positive experience.**

Action Plans:

- A. Develop a plan to focus the reunion experience to benefit the candidates.

**5. Education (130) Issue: Candidates and members do not fully understand the degrees, mission, organization and opportunities of the Scottish Rite.**

Action Plans:

- A. Develop a plan to educate candidates and members to more fully understand the degrees, mission, organization and opportunities of the Scottish Rite.

**6. Leadership (128) Issue: There is a Lack of delegation of authority and acceptance of responsibility and accountability.**

Action Plans:

- A. Develop job descriptions for committee chairs and officers.
- B. Create a system of delegation and accountability for leaders of the Valley.
- C. Create an annual review process of leaders.

**7. Training (125) Issue: A training program for officers and leaders of the valley is needed to insure proper succession.**

Action Plan:

- A. Create a plan to identify and develop future leaders.

**8. Mentoring (122) Issue: Proper mentoring has deteriorated in the valley.**

Action Plans:

- A. Investigate why there is a deterioration of mentoring in the valley.
- B. Investigate existing mentoring programs
- C. Develop and effective plan to address mentoring in the valley.

**14. Outreach (92) Issue: Community involvement is limited and lacks planning, goals, tracking, execution and consistency.**

Action Plans:

- A. Develop a plan to improve community involvement.

**15. PR External/Internal (85) Issue: We do not have an internal or external Public Relations program.**

Action Plans:

- A. Develop an internal and external Public Relations program.

**16. Rules and by-laws (73) Issue: Clubs, bodies, committees and other organizations of the valley may not have current functional by-laws to regulate their activities. Therefore, it affects their ability to function properly.**

Action Plans:

- A. Investigate and review existing bylaws of the clubs, bodies and committees of the valley.
- B. Develop process whereby bylaws may be created and revised.
- C. Develop an accountability procedure to ensure adherence to the bylaws.

**17. Recognition (61) Issue: Exclusive of honors, recognition programs do not exist.**

Action Plans:

- A. Create a system of member recognition in the valley.
- B. Investigate past and/or existing recognition programs.

**18. Perception (61) Issue: The general public, members and non Scottish Rite Masons do not understand the mission of Scottish Rite.**

Action Plans:

- A. Investigate the current perception of the Scottish Rite.
- B. Develop a plan to educate the general public, members and non Scottish Rite Masons of the mission.

**19. Clubs (57) Issue: We do not have an effective program to develop and support Scottish Rite Clubs.**

Action Plans:

- A. Investigate the current programs of the Scottish Rite Clubs.
- B. Create a program to develop and support Scottish Rite Clubs.
